Growing Champions

This year at Clay we are excited to report continued growth on our CAASPP! We had a LOT of students work really hard <u>keeping</u> Clay #1 in all districts in Fresno County in both ELA AND Math! In comparing similar school districts, we are #2 in the state of California for Math and #3 in ELA!

THIS IS GREAT NEWS, but we need to get back to the percentages Clay used to have and that is our goal. In ELA, our current percentage of meets and exceeds grew from 72% to 74%. Our goal is 80%. In Math we grew from 65% to 71% with our goal being 75% and ultimately 80% We know that great attendance and working together from home and school, we can do this!

EXCEED EXPECTATIONS Here are some other highlights of our CAASPP scores at Clay. Our top performing classes in MATH reaching the highest percentage of meets and exceeds were Miss Barsoom's 3rd graders with 88% and Mrs. Sawatzky/M̃rs. Jost in 4th grade at 82% The largest growth in math was earned by last year's 7th graders as they grew 26% from 45% to 71% and 68 distance from standard points! That's HUGE! In ELA the top performing class was last year's 8th grade taught by Mr. Gramza at 86% followed by those 3rd graders again and Miss Barsoom at 81% meets or exceeds. Mr. Gramza's ELA classes made the most growth in 7th and 8th with 14% growth and 30.9 Distance from standard points.

These students earned a perfect score in either Math or ELA or made the most growth on the 2024 CAASPP. Perfect scores go to Lyla Ketelsen, Kieran McClarty, Angadbir Singh, Nicholas Fierro, and Reed McClarty.

Making the most growth ranging from 150 to 400 points were Julia Johnson, Theodore Showalter, Noelle Bartell, Connor Rodriguez, Kendrick Warkentin
